Topic	- Cammack represents forty universities.	Action to be Taken

- It provides quarterly reviews of our funds to our Retirement Oversight Committee (ROC).
- Pitt currently has the lowest investment fees in Cammack's entire portfoloio.
- Internally at Cammack, they have annual fiduciary training.
- They have lead analysists who recommend funds within asset classes. One of these (Mari) is specifically designated for Pitt.
- They began with a behavioral study (investment behavior) of Pitt employees and a thorough look at our employee use of the retirement plan.
- Being on Wall Street, they have easy access to Portfolio Managers at the investment firms. In fact, those portfolio managers reach out to Cammack with information.
- Cammack has 3(21) Fiduciary status. A standard definition of this responsibility is provided by the Benefits Consultants Group blog:
  - "Section 3(21) of ERISA generally defines an ERISA fiduciary as someone who exercises any discretionary authority or control regarding the management of an employee benefit plan or the disposition of its assets." So Cammack identifies itself as a fiduciary with Pitt. It is on record as responsible for recommending particular funds. It interacts with the ROC and the ROC hears and responds to recommendations from Cammack.
- The process for selecting or deleting funds from our array:
   --Something triggers a change in the fund (new manager, major loss, etc...) and the fund goes on a watch list.
- The metrics for selection come from the quality of fund management. Active management is more expensive. Passive management is cheap, but basically mimics index funds.
- Cammack has its own investment scorecard with criteria for evaluating funds.
   Its analysts do in-depth independent review of comparable funds to select the best ones.
- Cammack has brought into our array of investment funds some fund from investment companies such as JP Morgan, Wells Farco, and American Funds beyond just Fidelity, Vanguard, and TIAA that we used to have.
