6. Sustainability

- Aurora Sharrard, PhD, Executive Director of Sustainability, Office of Sustainability- Sustainability Literacy and Culture Survey was done in 2023, done every three years on campus. Published a progress report on Pitt's progress across 68 goals for sustainability https://www.sustainable.pitt.edu/progress-report/; Pitt also publishes Green Guides for students (on-campus and off campus living) and faculty.
- Pitt recognized nationally and locally in certifications and ranks including STARS Certification – Pitt ranks GOLD. 5 most recognized sustainability efforts- LEED Building, BikeShare, Surplus Property, Farmers Market, Electric Vehicles/Charging Stations; As an institution Pitt conducts annual greenhouse gas emissions and reductions – 34.6% below baseline for 2022.
- Rooftop solar arrays will be installed in January and February 2024.

- 80 electric vehicle chargers on campus, 238 electric fleet vehicles;
 95% ground equipment has gone electric.
