Discussion

There was a complaint from the medical school that there were no representatives from the basic sciences. Complaints will need to be dealt with through Bylaws changes. We expect to hear more from the Bylaws committee in the future regarding this matter. Additionally, we are notifying the Chancellor of some concerns to that he can address issues of representativeness in his appointments.

KOVACS:

Some people complained about lack of part-time faculty (senior faculty) regarding voting. More focus on the announcement of elections. Survey to understand the "shameful" lack of interest in faculty affairs. Some members should volunteer to find out.

WEINBERG:

What has changed between 2009 and now. Specifically, we had the University Times in hardcopy. Now it's one of many "Read Green" announcements. So the question is did people even know?

MOLINARO:

In 2009 the only announcement in 2009 was HOW to vote. It was handled almost identically in 2009 as it was this year. Eligible voters received four Read Green announcements.

ROHRER:

From early on in the process, there was a concern that people did not know about the process. Impression was a lack of awareness.

BECKER:

In calculating the School of Medicine denominator, how is that determined. MOLINARO: all Health Science eligible faculty.

WILSON: Numbers provided -- 2009: 262/2308, 2018: 246/2567

BALABAN:

Do we know if people accessed the ballot and chose not to vote as a measure of overall voting behaviors?

KOVACS:

Email addresses may be an issue

LOUGHLIN:

The drop is huge; this is more than an email address issue --- this goes back to hardcopy announcements and lack of University Times

MUNRO:

Read Green announcement headings are not catching people's attention, especially on phones.

SPRING:

We are facing issues around communication, for example the University Times from hardcopy to electronic. I wonder if people know that Provost Beeson is stepping down --- news is communicated quite differently in focus that in the past. In the past, issues would be announced and then discussed in the Times across issues --- that helped to focus the conversation more fully. Perhaps it is time to convene an ad hoc committee to consider issues of communication with and regarding faculty.

SUKITS:

What do we want the outcome to be? Is it sending out info? Or is it that

people get it and READ it? Online switch often decreases response rate --- we've seen that with online OMETs and our outreach to veterans, as well.

HARPER:

"Flashes" on announcement screens – do we have access or make use of these boards as one way to inform.

MOLINARO: each school controls each screen; we currently do not use it centrally

WILSON: follow up in each school by members

SPRING:

We need to take responsibility, as Carey Balaban suggested, however there are many different types of people among the faculty; Senate is not truly representative across all faculty, for example. Some colleagues may need more direct effort to engage them.

KOVACS:

There is a reality and convenience about how people engage with communication that are beyond "responsibility."

Senate Elections:

Current READ GREEN – Announcement regarding Senate elections of officers, Faculty Assembly members, Standing Committees. PLEASE READ THEM. This will also include the first official voting for the new Faculty Affairs committee (staggered appointments, 3 to 1 year, based on highest to lower votes). Consider how each of us can encourage voter turnout!! March deadline.
